Parables

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The same day went Jesus out of the house, and sat by the sea si de. And great multitudes were gathered together unto him, so th at he went into a ship, and sat; and the whole multitude stood on the shore. And he spake many things unto them in parables, s aying, Behold, a sower went forth to sow; And when he sowed, so me seeds fell by the way side, and the fowls came and devoured them up: Some fell upon stony places, where they had not much e arth: and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepnes s of earth: And when the sun was up, they were scorched; and be cause they had no root, they withered away. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up, and choked them: But other f ell into good ground, and brought forth fruit, some an hundredf old, some sixtyfold, some thirtyfold. Who hath ears to hear, le t him hear. And the disciples came, and said unto him, Why spea kest thou unto them in parables? He answered and said unto them , Because it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kin gdom of heaven, but to them it is not given. For whosoever hath , to him shall be given, and he shall have more abundance: but whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken away even that he h ath. Therefore speak I to them in parables: because they seeing see not; and hearing they hear not, neither do they understand . And in them is fulfilled the prophecy of Esaias, which saith, By hearing ye shall hear, and shall not understand; and seeing ye shall see, and shall not perceive: For this people's heart is waxed gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their e yes they have closed; lest at any time they should see with the ir eyes, and hear with their ears, and should understand with t heir heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them. Bu t blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear. For verily I say unto you, That many prophets and righteo us men have desired to see those things which ye see, and have not seen them; and to hear those things which ye hear, and have not heard them. Hear ye therefore the parable of the sower. Wh en any one heareth the word of the kingdom, and understandeth i t not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was sown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the w ay side. But he that received the seed into stony places, the s ame is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it ; Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended. He also that received seed among the th orns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, a nd the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful. But he that received seed into the good ground is he that heareth the word, and understandeth it; which also bear eth fruit, and bringeth forth, some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ¶Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened unto a man which sowed good se

ed in his field: But while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat, and went his way. But when the blade was sprung up, and brought forth fruit, then appeared the tares al so. So the servants of the householder came and said unto him, Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in thy field? from whence the n hath it tares? He said unto them, An enemy hath done this. Th e servants said unto him, Wilt thou then that we go and gather them up? But he said, Nay; lest while ye gather up the tares, y e root up also the wheat with them. Let both grow together unti 1 the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the rea pers, Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bund les to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn. Another pa rable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field: Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches th ereof. Another parable spake he unto them; The kingdom of heave n is like unto leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three mea sures of meal, till the whole was leavened. All these things sp ake Jesus unto the multitude in parables; and without a parable spake he not unto them: That it might be fulfilled which was s poken by the prophet, saying, I will open my mouth in parables; I will utter things which have been kept secret from the found ation of the world. Then Jesus sent the multitude away, and wen t into the house: and his disciples came unto him, saying, Decl are unto us the parable of the tares of the field. He answered and said unto them, He that soweth the good seed is the Son of man; The field is the world; the good seed are the children of the kingdom; but the tares are the children of the wicked one; The enemy that sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; and the reapers are the angels. As therefore the tares are gathered and burned in the fire; so shall it be in th e end of this world. The Son of man shall send forth his angels , and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offe nd, and them which do iniquity; And shall cast them into a furn ace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth. Then shall the righteous shine forth as the sun in the kingdom of t heir Father. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear. ¶Again, the k ingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the whic h when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth a

nd selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly p earls: Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went an d sold all that he had, and bought it. Again, the kingdom of he aven is like unto a net, that was cast into the sea, and gather ed of every kind: Which, when it was full, they drew to shore, and sat down, and gathered the good into vessels, but cast the bad away. So shall it be at the end of the world: the angels sh all come forth, and sever the wicked from among the just, And s hall cast them into the furnace of fire: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth. Jesus saith unto them, Have ye understo od all these things? They say unto him, Yea, Lord. Then said he unto them, Therefore every scribe which is instructed unto the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, w hich bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old.
